WHAT'S ALL THIS TALK ABOUT ROUNDABOUTS?

With FDOT's design projects in Collier County such as SR 29 from CR 846 E to SR 82, roundabouts are being considered more often as part of roadway improvements. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) identifies them as a proven safety countermeasure because they can significantly reduce crashes that cause serious injuries or fatalities.



Roundabouts enhance safety by promoting lower speeds and reducing conflict points, which decreases both the likelihood and severity of crashes, improve traffic flow, and adapt well to a wide range of conditions because their design can be tailored to the surrounding environment.
