# MPO Overview

Designated by federal law: 23 United States Code (U.S.C.) 134, 49 U.S.C. 5303, 23 Code of Federal Regulations 450.310, and 339.175 Florida Statutes.

Responsible for the development of the area's transportation plans and for coordinating the transportation planning process.

Exists in all urban areas over 50,000 in population, if the agencies in that area spend federal money on transportation improvements.

Collier MPO was established in 1982.

The goal is to provide a **continuing, cooperative**, and **comprehensive** ("3-C") planning process.

# Transportation Disadvantaged (TD) Persons

- ▶ **“Transportation disadvantaged” means those persons who because of physical or mental disability, income status, or age are unable to transport themselves or to purchase transportation and are, therefore, dependent upon others to obtain access to health care, employment, education, shopping, social activities, or other life-sustaining activities, or children who are handicapped or high-risk or at-risk as defined in s. 411.202.**

# TD Program Overview

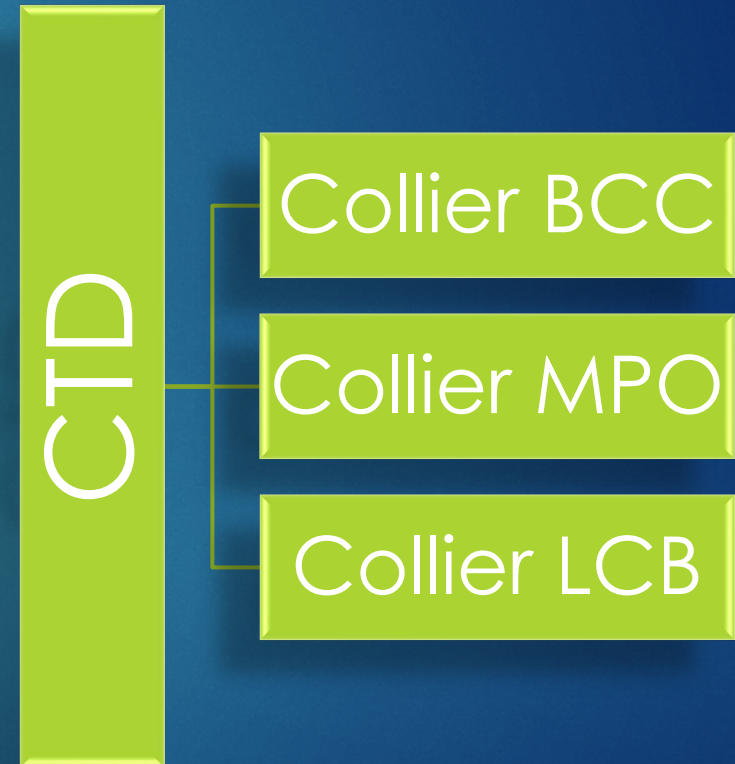
In 1979, Legislature created the program to be “fully responsive to the needs” of this population. Legislature created CTD and TD Trust Fund in 1989.

The purpose was to “coordinate” transportation services in each county in Florida.

Implemented by three primary entities at local level:

- Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) – Oversees the delivery of TD services in designated county or multi-county area.
- Planning Agency – Coordinates planning activities for local TD program.
- Local Coordinating Board (LCB) – Represents stakeholders and advises on the delivery of TD services.

CTD also works with state/local partners or “purchasing agencies” to coordinate funding for these services.



# What is “Coordinated Transportation”?

“Coordination” is the arrangement of transportation “in a manner that is cost-effective, efficient, and reduces fragmentation and duplication of services” (s. 427.011, F.S.).

*For example, an individual may have access to medical transportation through Medicaid but requires another funding source to access employment.*

Paratransit trips that are not “sponsored” by any other agency or provided as an extension of the fixed-route system may be purchased under the TD Trust Fund.

If TD riders are physically able to access the fixed-route system, TD funds may be used to purchase bus passes (more cost-effective than paratransit services).

## CTD Responsibilities

- ▶ Independent state government agency, administratively housed within the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT).
- ▶ Consists of seven board members, appointed by the Governor, and eight (non-voting) advisors representing state agencies, including FDOT.
- ▶ Administers the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund and distributes funding through its grant programs.
- ▶ Develops rules and policies governing the Coordinated System.
- ▶ Approves and contracts with CTCs to support the delivery of TD services.
- ▶ Designates the planning agency to implement program at local level, including staffing the Local Coordinating Boards.
- ▶ Submits an annual performance report to the Governor and Legislature.



# Planning Agency Responsibilities



- ▶ Assists the CTC and LCB in implementing local TD program.
- ▶ Staffs and appoints members to the LCB.
- ▶ Facilitates the procurement of the CTC and recommends approval by the CTD.
- ▶ Works with CTC and LCB in developing the TD Service Plan.
- ▶ Reviews the CTC's Annual Operating Report and submits to the LCB each year.
- ▶ Administers LCB meetings and complies with requirements of annual TD Planning Grant.
- ▶ Evaluates the performance of the CTC (along with LCB) annually.

# LCB Responsibilities

- ▶ Represents local stakeholders of the TD program, including:
  - Local elected officials (LCB Chair)*
  - Purchasing agencies (FDOT, Agency for Persons with Disabilities, etc.)*
  - Transportation provider organizations*
  - Rider advocates*
- ▶ Assists in establishing eligibility guidelines and trip priorities.
- ▶ Assists CTC and Planning Agency with developing the TD Service Plan.
- ▶ Evaluates the performance of the CTC.
- ▶ Appoints a grievance committee.

# Other LCB Fiscal Year Activities

- ▶ Meets at least quarterly.
- ▶ Annually reviews and updates the LCB Bylaws.
- ▶ Annually holds a public workshop/LCB training.
- ▶ Annually reviews and approves the CTC's rate model for TD trips.
- ▶ Annually reviews and updates the LCB's Grievance Policy.
- ▶ Reviews grant applications involving TD funds.
- ▶ Reviews quarterly reports from the MPO and the CTC.

# CTC Responsibilities

- ▶ May be a transit agency, non-profit organization, for-profit company, or local governmental entity.
- ▶ Provides and/or contracts with transportation companies to deliver trips to TD customers in Collier County.
- ▶ Recommends TD eligibility guidelines and trip prioritization to LCB.
- ▶ Assists LCB in developing the TD Service Plan.
- ▶ Submits performance data to the CTD, compiled within the Annual Operating Report (AOR).





## ADA Trips

Trip origin and destination are within the ADA corridor (within  $\frac{3}{4}$  mile from a CAT fixed route)

Passenger has recognized disability verified by a medical professional

Passenger is unable to utilize CAT fixed route service

## TD Trips

Trip origin or destination is outside the ADA corridor but within Collier County

Passenger has a physical or mental disability, or income status, that prevents ability to transport oneself

OR the passenger is a child who is handicapped or high-risk or at-risk

# Distinction Between ADA and TD Trips



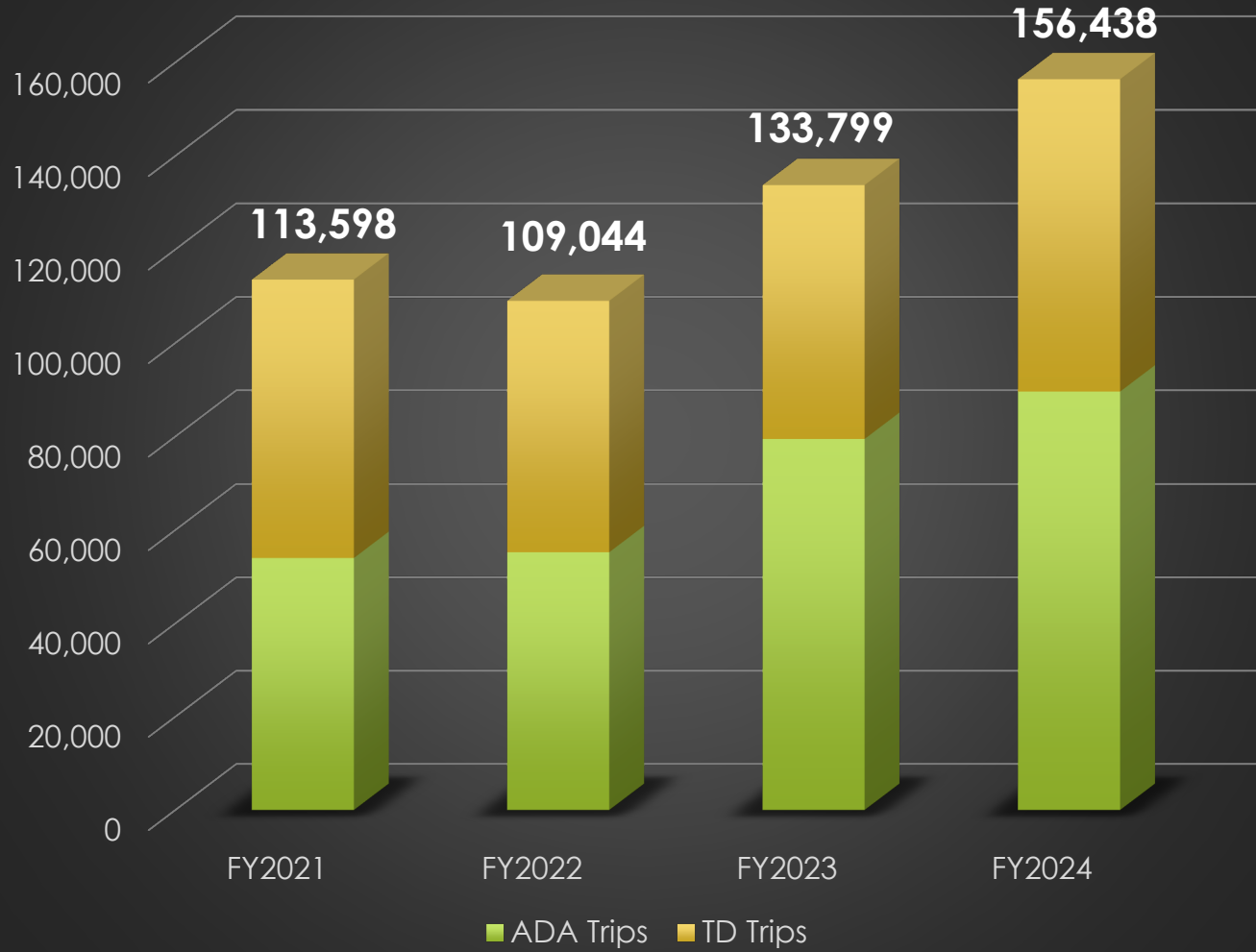
Priority	Trip Purpose – Categories and Definitions
1	<b>MEDICAL</b> -- medical, dental, or therapeutic services including hospital appointments; clinic visits; dialysis; health department; speech, occupational, physical therapies; psychiatric, psychological services.
2	<b>EMPLOYMENT</b> -- work or employment training education such as Job Service and vocational technical schools. a. Permanent disability employment trips b. Elderly or Low Income employment trips
3	<b>EDUCATION</b> -- K-12 Schools, Higher Education (College and University, Career and Adult Education)
4	<b>SOCIAL for agency-related activity</b> -- Support services such as those through Department of Children and Families, Department of Vocational Rehabilitation, mental health centers, churches, senior citizen programs. This includes civic responsibilities (governmental services, voting), but excludes nutritional programs.
5	<b>NUTRITIONAL</b> -- adult congregate meal programs, breakfast programs, food stamp procurement and food shopping trips.
6	<b>GROUP RECREATION</b> -- Group trips booked through a single reservation request for non-essential, non-employment related activities such as: bowling, bingo, beach, parks, restaurants, libraries, or theaters. A group is defined as a minimum of three (3) passengers having either the same trip origination or destination.
7	<b>PERSONAL BUSINESS</b> -- non-agency activities essential to maintenance of independence including banking, shopping, legal appointments, religious activities, etc. a. Disabled, elderly or low income b. Trips for persons with a self-created transportation hardship

## Collier Paratransit Trips by Fiscal Year

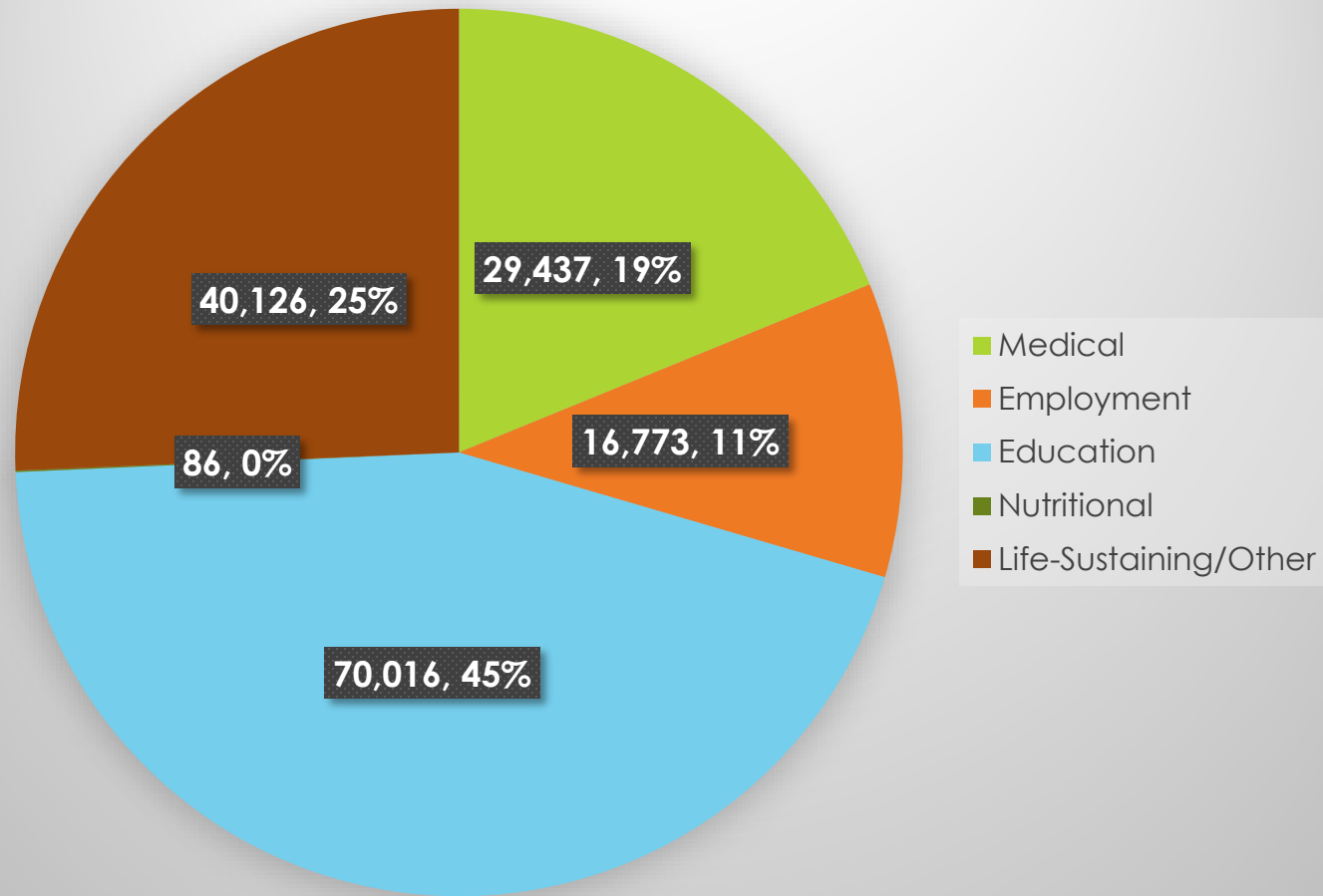

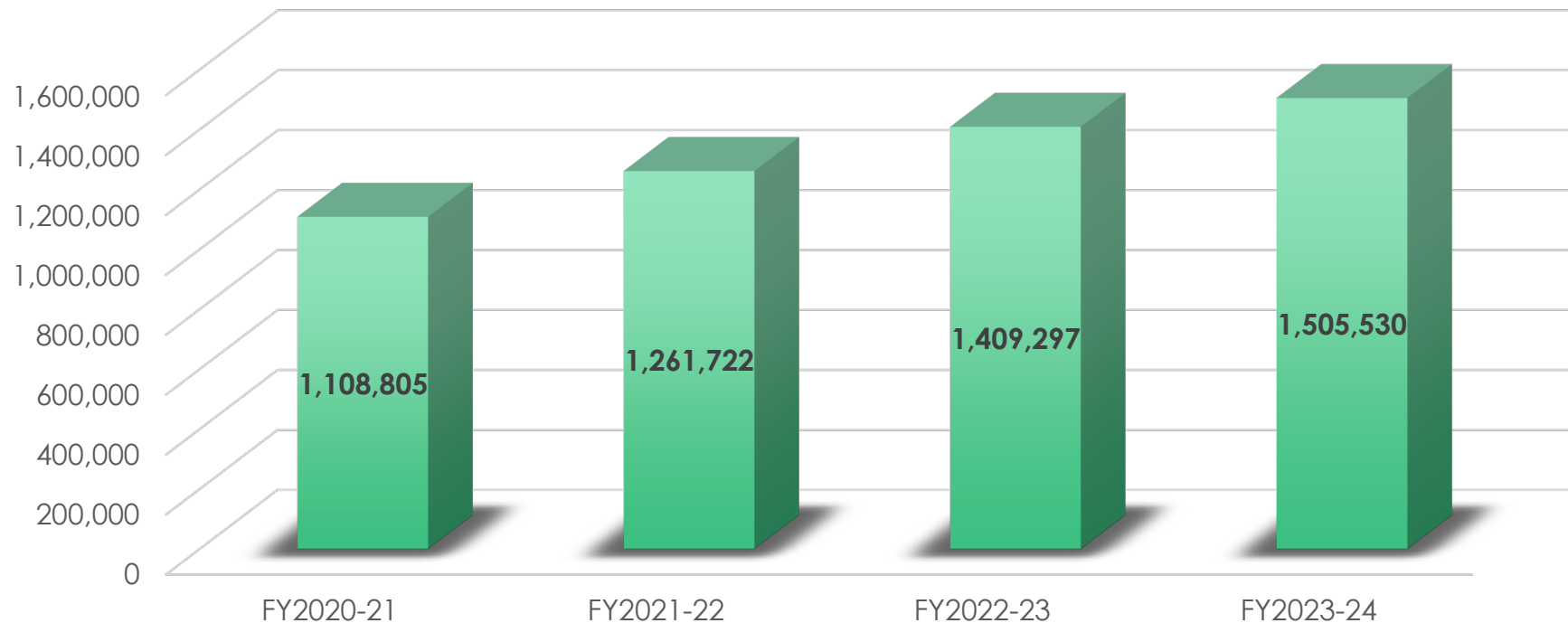
Trips by Trip Types

## LCB Meetings are Governed by Florida's Sunshine Laws (Sec. 286.011, Fla. Stat.)

- ▶ Reasonable notice of LCB meetings must be given.
- ▶ Meeting Minutes are required to be taken.
- ▶ Meetings must be open to the public.
- ▶ Documents and correspondence related to the transaction of official business of LCB are public records.
- ▶ Communications between LCB members regarding the transaction of official business of LCB must be made at LCB meetings.



# Sunshine Law Reminders for LCB Members

No pre or post meeting discussions with other LCB members regarding matters that may be discussed at a LCB meeting.

Do not use non-member liaisons between members.

As a LCB member, any correspondence or emails to or from you relating to your service on LCB is a public record.

If a matter before LCB creates a conflict of interest for you, abstain from voting and from persuasive discussion on the matter.

## INFORMATION ABOUT THE SUNSHINE LAW FOR MEMBERS

The Sunshine Law applies to local government boards and provides citizens with the right of access to the process to provide for citizen involvement in the making of decisions by advisory committees and boards.

Some important aspects of the Sunshine Law that apply to being a member of the MPO's advisory committees or boards are as follows:

- Any discussion between two or members of the same committee/board on any topic that could come before the committee/board for discussion is considered a meeting under the Sunshine Law. ***The Sunshine Law specifically applies when two or more members of the same committee/board discuss a matter that may foreseeably come before the same board or committee. This includes written correspondence.***
- There are three basic requirements of the Sunshine Law<sup>i</sup>:
  - Meetings of public boards, commissions or committees must be open to the public.
  - Reasonable notice of such meetings must be given.
  - Minutes of the meeting must be taken.

Important reminders for members of the MPO's advisory committees/boards are as follows:

1. No pre or post meeting discussions with other committee/board members regarding matters that may be discussed at a committee/board meeting.
2. Do not use non-member liaisons between members.
3. As a committee/board member, any correspondence or emails to or from you relating to your committee/board service is a public record.
4. If a matter before the committee/board creates a conflict of interest for you<sup>ii</sup>, abstain from voting and from persuasive discussion on the matter.
