A. Review and Endorse the Proposed Fiscal Year 2027-2031 Transportation Improvement Program

Mr. Kingston said the projects funded in the FY 27-31 TIP originated in the MPO's 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan and were directed by FDOT's Work Program. Additional material would be included: Sections 5.0, Transit Asset Management Measures and 6.0, Transit Safety Performance Measures to Appendix K: Addressing Performance Management Requirements.

It was noted that the project sheets excluded the Moving Florida Forward (MFF) projects.

***Mr. Rivera** moved to endorse the Proposed Fiscal Year 2027-2031 Transportation Improvement Program with the condition that the excluded MFF projects, including the Immokalee Road Interchange, and performance guidance be added. **Vice-Chair Scott** seconded. Passed unanimously.*

B. Endorse 2026 Project Priority Lists: Planning Study, Joint Collier and Lee County Regional, Transit, SUN Trail, and Highway & Freight

Ms. Monroy noted that there were no changes since the Committee reviewed the 2026 Project Priority Lists at their April meeting.

Chair Bickett moved to endorse the 2026 Project Priority Lists: Planning Study, Joint Collier and Lee County Regional, Transit, SUN Trail, and Highway & Freight. **Mr. Garrett** seconded. Passed unanimously.

C. Endorse the 2026 Annual List of Project Priorities (LOPP) for SU Box Funds

Ms. Monroy noted that there were no changes since the Committee reviewed the 2026 Annual LOPP for Surface Transportation Block Grant-Urban (SU) and Transportation Alternative (TA) funds.

Mr. Garrett moved to endorse the 2026 Annual List of Project Priorities for SU Box Funds. **Mr. Rivera** seconded. Passed unanimously.

A. Letter of Support for Miccosukee Tribe's FY 2026 Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Implementation Grant Application

Ms. Monroy said the Miccosukee Tribe requested a letter of support from the MPO to submit their application for a FY 2026 SS4A Grant to implement data-driven safety infrastructure improvements and to eliminate and reduce roadway fatalities and serious injuries.

Ms. Monroy noted that the proposed Build America 250 Act proposes to add funding for the SS4A program. The Act proposes federal registration fees for electric and hybrid vehicles.

B. Letter of Support for Southwest Florida Regional Planning Council's FY 2026 Safe Streets and Roads for All Supplemental Planning and Demonstration Grant Application

Ms. Monroy said SWFRPC requested a letter of support from the MPO to submit their application for a FY 2026 SS4A Grant to develop a data-driven approach to advancing multi-jurisdictional emergency response, and enhanced situational awareness during roadway incidents and mutual aid events.

Mr. Finney added that emergency-response technologies could ensure local agencies and first responders can better respond to incidents.
